Paint Job Basic Skills Training

Prepwork: Taping

- Taping is used to make sure painting stays in certain areas and that edges are crisp
- 1. Stick down tape along edge of wall
- 2. Run finger along tape to smooth it out and make it secure
- 3. Double check that taping is precise and smooth
- Doorframes, windows, ceilings, floor ridges

Painting: Loading a Paintbrush

- Dip the brush in the tray
- Then work the brush against the ridges of the tray
 - As if painting the ridges of the tray
 - Use both sides of the brush so that paint is uniform throughout
- You're trying to get as much paint on the wall without it dripping everywhere on the way

Painting: Using a paintbrush

- Used for details and doing edge work against tape
- Work from above the tape and paint down horizontally into it
- After painting the line against the edge...
 - Use a long stroke to smooth out the paint
 - Feather out paint heavy areas so that the whole area is uniform

Painting: Loading a Roller

- Set the roller in the well and roll down the slope of the pan a few times
- Drippy roller \rightarrow overloaded



Painting: Using the roller

- Used for larger surface areas
- 1. Paint zigzag pattern (M,N,W)
- Fill in with horizontal/vertical zigzag strokes
- 3. Finish with vertical strokes from Unpainted to painted areas



- a. At each stroke, raise roller at end so there's no mark
- 4. Repeat and smooth new application with previous
- Don't work from the edge
